Full Day

Staggered Arrival Times

- Kindergarten, First, Second 7:15 a.m. - 7:30 a.m.
- Third, Fourth, Fifth 7:30 a.m. - 7:45 a.m.

Staggered Dismissal Times

- First & Second 3:15 p.m. - 3:20 p.m.
- Third, Fourth, Fifth 3:20 - 3:30 p.m.
 - Older Siblings will be dismissed with younger siblings
 - Grade level and classrooms will be assigned gates
 - First Grade Front Gates & Second Grade Backgate
 - Third Grade Front Gates
 - Fourth Back Gate
 - Fifth Side Gate
- Kindergarten 1:30 p.m. Dismissal
 - One classroom at each front gate

Split Day

Cohort 1: 7:45 a.m. - 11:15 a.m.

- Lunch 11:15 a.m.-11:30 a.m.

Cohort 2: 12:15 p.m. - 3:45 p.m.

- Lunch 12:00 p.m.-12:15 p.m.
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- 3 ½ hours of instruction
- 10 minute recess
- Once a week Art/Spanish and Music/P.E. for 30 minutes
- Breakfast and lunch served to students - *Food Service dependant on FUSD
 - Breakfast would be in 2 cohorts based on class schedule
 - 7:15 a.m. -7:35 a.m. Cohort 1 Students
 - 7:50 a.m. - 8:05 a.m. Cohort 2 Students

Online Learning

- Daily attendance taken and monitored
- Will follow grade level instruction and expectations
- Normal school grading policy will apply
- Classroom deadlines will apply
- Will have to participate for an extended amount of time
 - Cannot opt for online learning for two weeks and move back into a classroom week three
- Will require support from an adult
- Teachers will not be available during class time to support

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School Systems

Arrival

- All students' temperatures taken with a health survey
 - Ms. Pentorali taking temperatures in cars in the valet line and asking health survey
 - Mrs. Trevino at main gate entrance conducting screenings for walking traffic
 - Students walk across a disinfectant mat and disinfect hands with hand sanitizer
 - One-way traffic on campus
 - Students will report directly to classrooms if not eating breakfast
 - Students eating breakfast will pick up from the cafeteria and report to class
 - Parents and family members will not be permitted on campus during arrival
 - Social distancing will be implemented on campus and by outside gate
 - We are asking for families to not linger outside of gates and stay six feet apart
 - It is highly recommended that students wear face coverings when entering campus
 - Handwashing upon entry into classrooms

Recess

- | Field divided into three separate sections
- | Classrooms will not mix with one another
- | Each classroom will have their own set of equipment
 - Non equipment games will be taught and recommended
 - Handwashing before and after recess
- | No drinking fountains - please send student with a water bottle
- | Bathrooms will be monitored - face coverings are recommended
 - Stalls and sinks taped off to ensure social distancing
- | 6 feet apart
- | Students will not be asked to wear face coverings when outdoors with social distancing



Classroom

- | Working on building partitions for each classroom
- | Face coverings are highly recommended
 - Face shields are a great option for students
- | No communal supplies
 - Supply donations will be for individual students; extras will be stored to use as needed for the classroom; Wish list items are for use in general
- | Hand washing every two hours with hand sanitizer in between
- | Doors and windows open
- | Every classroom equipped with two standing oscillating fans
- | Outdoor instruction when weather permits
- | One-to-One technology
- | Specialty classes taught in students' home room
- | No library or computer lab
- | Limited paper passing and collecting
- | Virtual field trips and guest speakers

School Systems





People on Campus

- **Volunteers and visitors limited or none**
- **No shared food for celebrations**
- **No whole-school events or assemblies**
- **Parent meetings conducted virtually if possible**
- **PVC meetings held virtually**
- **No group or panoramic pictures**



Health & Wellness

- Students and staff with 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit temperature will not be allowed on campus
- Students and staff with COVID-19 like symptoms will be asked to stay home for a minimum of 24 hours
- Each classroom will have their own set of disposable first aid items
- Limiting nurse office traffic
- Touchless thermometers purchased
- Daily disinfecting and sanitizing taking place
- Teaching students how to properly cough, sneeze, and wash hands
- Teaching students the importance of social distancing
- Proper use of face coverings
- Daily temperature and health screenings for students and staff
- Currently working on COVID-19 protocols with the County Public Health Office



What we need from our community

- Keep kiddos home if they are sick
 - Sending kids to school unwell can jeopardize the safety and health of classmates and entire school community.
- Teach and reinforce proper handwashing and facial covering usage
- Practice social distancing
- Teach students what a sore throat means and feels like
- Teach students what a cough means and feels like

- Have conversations of what common symptoms are for them due to allergies or other medical conditions versus COVID-19 symptoms
